What would Dewey think of Mission Hill School?

In what ways does the educational program at Mission Hill fit Dewey's idea of Progressive Education? Are there similarities? Differences?

SMALLER:

How is knowledge viewed at Mission Hill? Does this mesh with Dewey?

How does Dewey's idea of 'experience at the center of learning' take form at Mission Hill?

Progressive Education, as Dewey defines it, is more democratic than traditional. What does that mean? Did you see examples of this at Mission Hill?

What is the role of the teacher in Progressive Education? How does this look at Mission Hill?

How does Dewey view classroom management (he speaks of social control)? What does this look like at Mission Hill?

How do experiences matter in Dewey's model of Progressive Education? What role do experiences play at Mission Hill?

Dewey says freedom of movement in a classroom should not be an end itself. What does this mean? How does this work at Mission Hill?

Look at Alfie Kohn's 8 values of Progressive Education. To what extent does Mission Hill match up?

Does Mission Hill fall into any of the traps of Progressive Education that Kohn discusses in the *What it isn't* or *Why it's rare* sections?
